



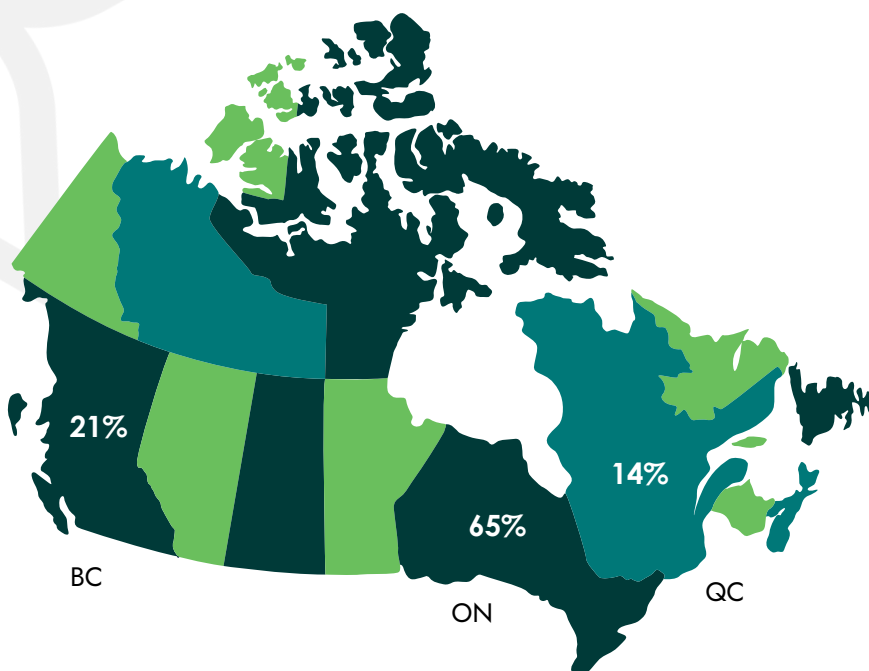
ART STREAM 2021 EVALUATION REPORT

Executive Summary

The Creation's Art Stream 2021 grant recipients directed their projects toward cultural revitalization, emphasizing artistic expression, community engagement, and youth empowerment. The grants played a crucial role in supporting Indigenous youth, offering financial assistance, skill development, and sustainable programming. The projects successfully established safe and inclusive spaces, promoted artists' work, and improved access to art supplies and collaborative environments. Despite challenges like inexperience, scheduling issues, and budget allocation, adaptability and effective communication helped overcome obstacles. The grantees acquired valuable skills in creating safe spaces, practical skills, and communication. The outcomes met in projects included increasing accessibility, empowering Indigenous youth, knowledge sharing, and community building.

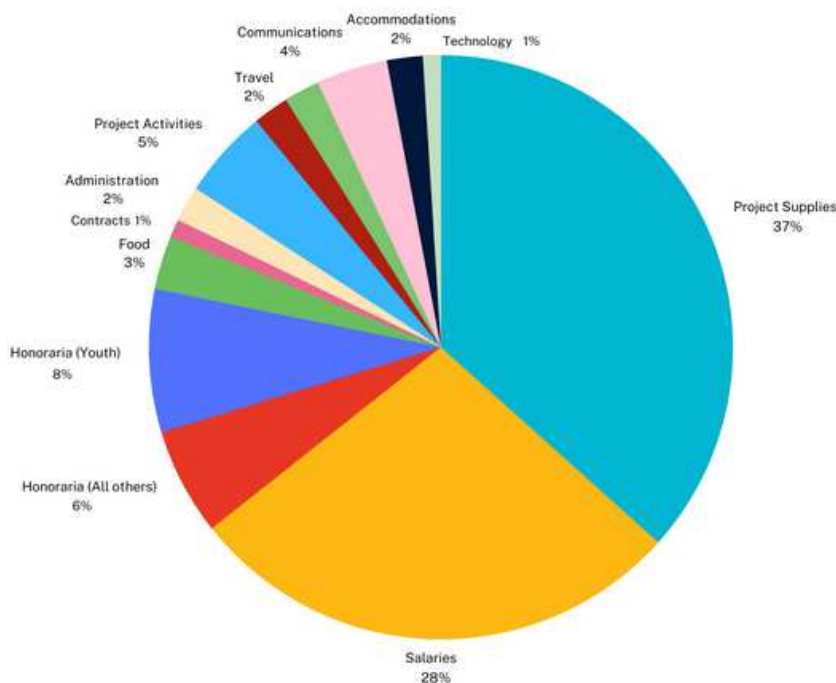
\$109,127.29 in funding was distributed

% STREAM FUNDING AMOUNT BY BUDGET ITEM CATEGORY



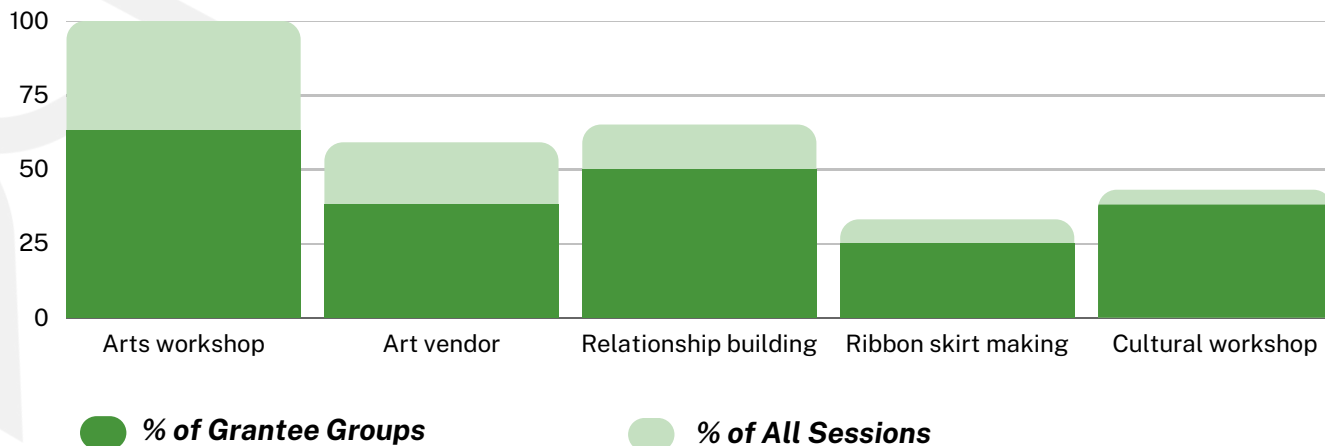
